

Advent can be a deeply prayerful time of preparation for the coming of the Lord at Christmas. For four weeks, we take a spiritual journey towards the Incarnation—God's coming into the world: *Emmanuel*, God-is-with-us.

At the same time, however, the days leading up to Christmas can be extremely stressful. I don't know about you, but I tend to get overwhelmed by the amount of things that need to get done. Shopping for gifts can be stressful especially when everyone else can be as stressed out and annoyed as we are. There are a lot of devotions to keep Christ in Christmas and in Advent. We have the Advent wreath, of course, in which we light a new candle each week leading up to the Nativity. We have Jesse Trees and Advent calendars marking the days until Christmas. Many of us also get little prayer books to help us prepare for the coming of the Lord.

There is one prayer, however, that can make a powerful impact on your preparation for the coming of the Lord. **The Angelus.**

If you're not convinced yet, here are seven reasons why you and your family and friends should pray the Angelus during this Advent season.

1. It's short.
2. Like Advent and Christmas, it is focused on the Incarnation.
3. It reminds us to keep Christ in Christmas.
4. In the Angelus, we give our time back to God.
5. By praying the Angelus, we walk with Mary from Annunciation to Incarnation.
6. The Angelus coincides with an important prayer on the Fourth Sunday of Advent.
7. The Angelus is a perfect addition to your Advent wreath devotion.

**St. Padre Pio Parish Unapproved Council Minutes
November 21, 2017, Elba Site**

We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."

Members in Attendance: Father Thaddeus Bocianowski, Reg Barcomb, Linda DeVito, Debbie Greene, Diane Fiorentino, Rob Greene, Charles Zambito, Mindy Stempin, Debbie Armbrewster, Mary Ann Dorman, Pauli Miano, Sue Zambito.

Members absent: Barb Hendershott, Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Justin Calarco-Smith, Nadyne Karas.

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm by Linda DeVito. The opening prayer was offered by Father Ted. Father Ted volunteered Deacon Paul to give the opening and closing prayers at the next meeting.

Minutes from the previous meeting: Motion to approve the minutes made by Diane, seconded by Mary Ann. Motion carried.

Open Forum:

Mission and procedures for Open Forum – The purpose of the forum is for parishioners to bring concerns to the council. They may do this in person or refer the issue to Father Ted or a council member. When a parishioner attends the meeting, their participation is limited to the forum. After discussion on the topic, they are excused. Advance notice of the topic for discussion is preferred, so any research can be done before the meeting. Topics brought forward by council members will be addressed under new business.

Organization and Committee Reports:

Altar and Rosary – Diane – Profit from Rummage Sale over \$1100. Penny Social attendance was about half of previous events. There were 177 baskets, 33 gift cards, and vegetables to be raffled off. There were problems with advertising and more volunteers are needed. A & R will have a discussion about possible changes to the event. Men's Group helped with both events. The Glimmer of Love is Dec. 9th, set up will be the Thursday/Friday before.

Men's Group – Rob – About 90 people were served at the Pancake Breakfast. Rose Elliott won the 50/50. Wine Appreciation went very well. 60 people attended. A bus trip to the winery could be considered in the future.

Liturgy Committee – Linda Giambone has agreed to chair the committee. She asked that council support the recruitment of additional ministers and the review of procedures for each ministry. She will attend the next meeting to discuss plans. Council agreed that recruitment and review is needed. Faith Formation students will be wearing new costumes at the 4 pm Christmas Eve Mass.

Bereavement – Leadership of the committee is in transition. Alice F. and Judy B. will continue through this year. Rebecca Blew will step in when they are not available. Linda will shop. Jan Goodenbery and Mary Moscicki will lead Team 3. Books on grief have been given to families of parishioners whose funeral mass or burial is from Padre Pio. They are available to be given to friends and families not from the parish, by contacting the office.

Lay Vicariate – Deb – The Vicariate includes parishes in Genesee and Wyoming counties. Father Hartwell from St. Michael's Parish is the vicar. At the meeting on November 20th, Father suggested that councils should review how they are operating to best serve parishioners, looking at the number and times of masses, including 3 to 5 year planning, as well as reporting on information from the parish. He reported that each parish should have a council, but some do not. Each parish may have 2 representatives to the Vicariate, so another parishioner could be appointed from St. Padre Pio. The meetings are held monthly at 7 pm on Mondays at different churches in the 2 counties. Anyone interested should contact Father Ted.

Areas of Attention:

Faith Formation:

Mary Ann reported that we are implementing the new faith formation curriculum as directed by Bishop Malone. The spiral curriculum teaches different aspects on themes of Catholic faith in each grade level, going deeper into the topics each year. The four components require each parish to attend to family engagement in the home and in connection with the parish community. This rigorous curriculum is adapted from the one provided by the USCCB, Washington, D.C. It is a work in progress, as we seek ways to effectively integrate it into our Faith Formation program.

Stewardship:

Oktoberfest – The wrap up meeting went well. A profit of \$11,900 was realized. Meal tickets should go on sale earlier, right after Labor Day. Kim Perl and Megan Nixon will no longer chair the basket raffle. New chair is needed. The Elba Fireman's Social Hall was a good site, with a larger area, tables and chairs available, and a complete kitchen. Expect a detailed report after Nadyne returns from vacation.

Building and Grounds – Reg reported that the windows on the Maple St. side of the Oakfield church need immediate attention. New Plexiglas protection will be attached to the frames until a complete repair can be done in 2019. Deacon has agreed to handle snow removal in Elba. In Oakfield, greeters and ushers usually spread salt when needed. Discussion on the needs that could be addressed by volunteers on the Day of Caring. Painting of church exterior window frames in Elba and the rectory basement in Oakfield should be considered.

Old Business:

Share the Journey Outreach Center – Deb reported that she had emptied the kitchen cupboards and that stocking of the non-food items for families of the migrant ministry will begin in January.

New Business:

Signboards at both sites – Signboards need updating. Father Ted's name is not on sign and changes in mass times should be posted. Pauli volunteered to help Deb with the changes.

Agenda setting process – Call for agenda information will be sent prior to agenda meeting. Any lengthy reports are preferred to be in writing.

Diocesan Office of Family Life – Request for volunteers to be advocates for addicts, training provided by diocese. Father will get more information on the program before we act.

Pastor's Comments: Father thanked Mindy and Debbie A. for their work in decorating the churches. The Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, and All Soul's Day displays received compliments from visitors to the parish.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer:

The meeting adjourned at 8:30 pm. Father offered the closing prayer.

Next meeting: January 9th at the Oakfield site.
