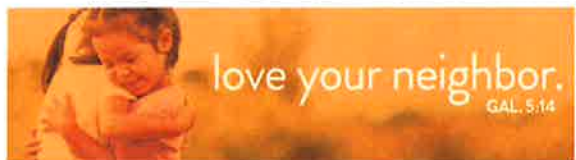

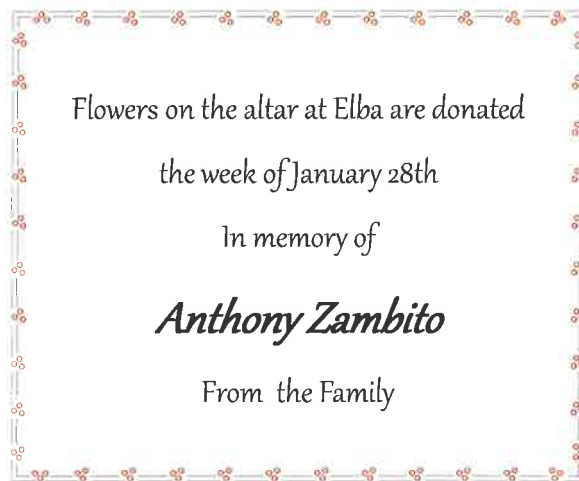

January 9, 2018, Oakfield Site

We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."

Members in Attendance: Father Thaddeus Bocianowski, Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Barb Hendershott, Reg Barcomb, Linda DeVito, Debbie Greene, Diane Fiorentino, Mindy Stempin, Debbie Armbruster, Mary Ann Dorman, Kevin Hendershott, Pauli Miano, Sue Zambito.

Members absent: Charles Zambito, Justin Calarco-Smith, Nadyne Karas.

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm by Barb Hendershott. The opening prayer was offered by Deacon Paul. Mindy offered to give the opening and closing prayers at the next meeting.

Minutes from the previous meeting: Motion to approve the minutes made by Reg, seconded by Sue. Motion carried.

Open Forum: No forum at this meeting.

Organization and Committee Reports:

Altar and Rosary – Diane – The Glimmer of Love Mass was Dec. 9th. We received \$2185 in donations. The Christmas party was on the 12th. \$150 was collected for the Religious Retirement Fund. A & R donated \$200 each to the following charities: All Babies Cherished, Cross Catholic Outreach, Crossroads House, Genesee Cancer Assoc., Genesee-Orleans Ministry of Concern, and St. Luke's Mission. We purchased lights for the tree in the park, and the tree top stars for both sites. We will be purchasing a rose colored vestment for Father Ted. Our next meeting is Feb. 13th in Elba. We will be sponsoring the "Bread Man" program in May. The next rummage sale is scheduled for April 21st.

Men's Group – Kevin – Chili Cook-off is Feb. 10th after the 4:30 mass. Set up will be on the 9th. We will continue with the chili and dessert competition, but we need new people to volunteer to judge. The 50-50 raffle will be held. We would like some Faith Formation students to help on either day. Mary Ann will reach out to the students. Chicken BBQ is in June as usual. Rob Greene has resigned as president, due to new work schedule. Kevin has assumed the position.

Liturgy Committee – Linda Giambone reported that the committee is looking to form subcommittees to review the ministry practices at both sites. Many pamphlets have been distributed over the years and training has taken place. Each pastor has his own interpretation as to how the ministries should flow at the weekend Masses, and with the change to one Saturday Mass, this is an appropriate time to review our guidelines. We would like to have a simplified booklet for each minister and one in place at each site. Once compiled, Father Ted will approve the booklet. We do not believe additional training is needed, but anyone requesting assistance with a particular ministry would be paired with someone familiar with the duties. The next Liturgy meeting is on the 22nd and we would like some progress by that time. Volunteers from council to work on this project are: Reg, Barb, Mindy, and Linda. Mindy will look for additional people who serve at Elba.

Areas of Attention:

Faith Formation: Mary Ann reported that Mass attendance has improved. The costumes donated by A & R were used at the Christmas Eve Children's Mass. Any child wishing to participate was given a costume. The 3 Kings were part of the procession last week, and the children will be asked to assist this weekend with bringing the statues from the creche to the rear of the church to close the Christmas season.

Stewardship:

Oktoberfest – Final total was \$11,975.00. Dinner - \$2042.36. Basket Raffle-\$4225.39. Cash Raffle - \$5181.05.

Bar/Water/Tip - \$ 526.20. A small difference of approximately \$1500.00 less than last year.

Thank you for the support of families and the Faith Formation students. More volunteers helped this year overall – it made a definite difference to have the extra hands – **thank you!**

Despite the heat, the facility was much more conducive to managing the food both inside and outside. Also, less labor intensive in set-up and tear down with not having to move tables/chairs from the church.

We've had many compliments on the meal this year – great job of cooking the pigs!

Kim Perl and Megan Nixon are retiring from the management of the Basket Raffle. The Committee is seeking new chairperson(s) to handle this piece for next year.

Oktoberfest 11th Annual will be on Saturday, September 22, 2018 at Elba Firemen's Rec Hall, Elba. Cash raffle tickets will

go on sale after Easter this year – look for more details in the bulletin. Anyone interested in joining the committee can contact Nadyne Karas or John Starowitz – co-chairs or attend any Oktoberfest upcoming planning meetings listed in the bulletin calendar.

Building and Grounds – Reg suggested to Father that a committee be formed to work on a new look for the entrance at the Oakfield site. The subject was discussed at the Finance Committee meeting. The flowering trees need to be removed, and it was decided that additional handicapped parking closer to the church is needed. Additional investigation is ongoing.

Father would like a diagram showing any proposal before work should begin.

Pauli inquired about the schedule for plowing at the Elba site. Deb reported that Derek Cassiano is now plowing both sites. He is scheduled to have the area plowed before masses, but additional plowing can be arranged when needed.

Old Business:

Share the Journey Outreach Center – Deb and Mary Ann reported that the Faith Formation students will be assisting with the cleaning and stocking of the rectory kitchen cupboards and a notice of the need for donations will be in the bulletin soon.

Signboards at both sites – Pauli reported that she had contacted a couple of individuals regarding needed changes to the signs. The process will cost several hundred dollars, but before a price can be considered, we need to decide what we want on the signs. Discussion followed.

New Business:

Parish Councils, Diocesan statistics and need for planning – Deb distributed a summary of a survey done by the Diocese, showing participation and characteristics of councils. Our council is within the norm of the parishes that responded. Many did not respond. Discussion followed on the request by the Diocese for councils to begin a planning process on their current status and where they see their parish in 3 to 5 years. We have begun the process with the Mass times survey and change. We are now looking at the ministries, and could continue the process by taking it topic by topic.

Missal Covers – Pauli said that the missal covers in Elba are in bad condition. Is there a plan to replace them? Deb said that there was a discussion about ordering different type of missal last year, but the Music Ministry decided to continue with the books we are using now. New covers will be ordered, blue for the Elba site and maroon for the Oakfield site.

Rugs at the entrance to the church in Elba – Mindy asked if an additional rug could be placed in the church so that snow, salt, etc. would not be tracked up the aisle? A rug was found for that purpose.

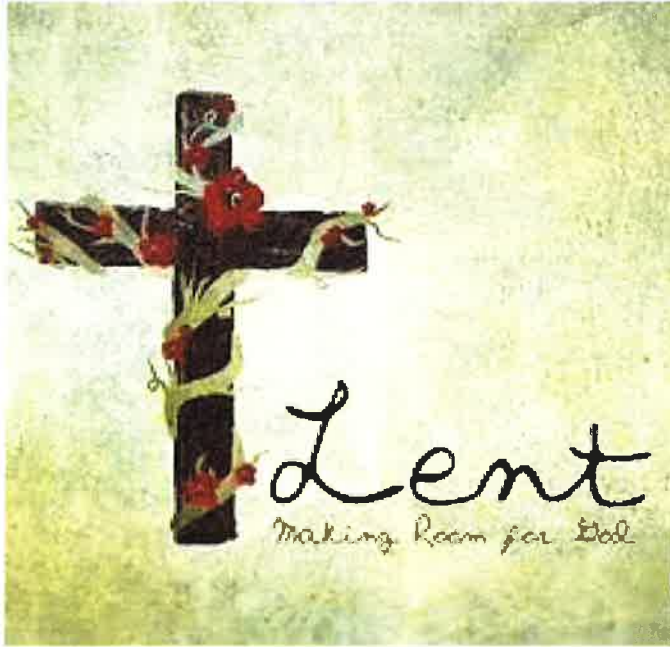
