CEMETERY NEWS

It's time to tidy up in order to maintain a well-kept Cemetery

Below are some reminders, stop at the office for the complete list of rules put together by the Cemetery Committee.

- No ground planting of flowers, trees, or shrubs is permitted. No edging material, such as plastic, steel, stone, wood chips, etc. is allowed.
 - The only items allowed on each plot other than the headstone are urns, flower pots, cemetery candles in proper receptacles, or military flags. All should be placed on or at either end of the headstone as space permits. Military flags should be placed tight to either end of the headstone. Nothing should be placed on the lot itself.
 - Flower pots should be removed by October 15th or they will be removed.
 - Christmas or winter decorations should be removed any time after January 1st or they may be removed at our discretion.
 - Artificial flowers and other decorations are permitted for a single season (May through October). If they become unsightly or weather-worn they will be removed.
 - The Cemetery will not be responsible for anything of a moveable character that may be lost or misplaced.
 - Any decoration deemed inappropriate, undignified, harmful or hazardous will be removed without notification or consultation.
- Cemeteries will be open from dawn until dusk.**

TIPS TO PRAY THE ROSARY EVERY DAY

Fall asleep praying the Rosary. It is better than counting sheep.

Say it in moments of sadness or spiritual drought.

If you can't pray a whole Rosary at once, break it into parts.

Use each mystery to ask for a particular intention.

Say it while you wait (for example, at the bus stop)

Recite the Rosary while doing chores or while you work out.

Pray while you walk and think of the people in your life.

Use images and music. The Rosary is a contemplative prayer.

If you're upset, pray for the situation that worries you.

One Minute Meditations

St. John XXIII

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was born to a poor farming family in Bergamo, Italy. His ordination as a priest in 1904 began a lifetime serving the Church as: the bishop's secretary, a military chaplain, cardinal-patriarch of Venice, and finally, as pope. Even so, St. John never forgot his humble origins, and he was known for visiting the poor, the sick and prisoners. As pope, he is most remembered for opening the Second Vatican Council. He died in 1963.



A Catholic's Job

Every Catholic has three tasks. Know the Catholic faith. We can't share it if we don't know it. Live the Catholic faith. It comes with us wherever we are. Spread the Catholic faith. We can't keep Christ to ourselves.

Three ways to walk Jesus' path

The magnificence of Heaven is simply beyond our comprehension. Our limited minds can't imagine how amazing it is. Jesus came to tell us about it and show us how to get there. He hoped we'd follow in his footsteps and do what he did.

Serve others with love. Jesus asked us to love one another as he did. Some of the ways he showed love were to treat strangers kindly, tend to the material needs of the needy, lend an attentive ear, help people make good and virtuous decisions that bring them closer to God. Try to show love in these ways daily.

Lighten your load. Not only did

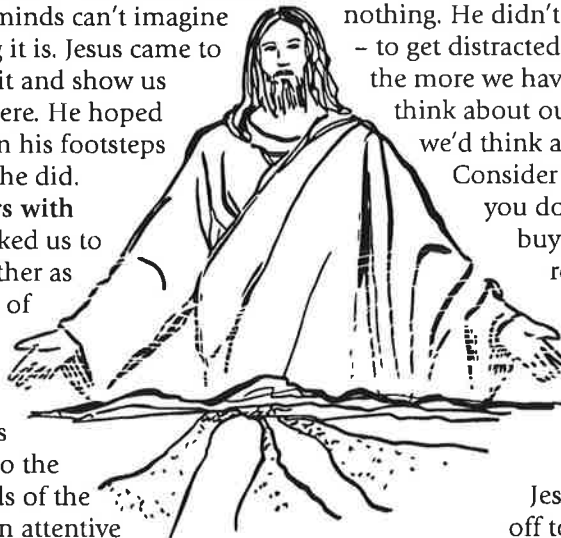
Jesus have few material goods, he sent his disciples out to preach with almost nothing. He didn't want them – or us – to get distracted. Jesus knew that the more we have, the more we'd think about our stuff and the less we'd think about God.

Consider shedding what you don't need, and buying only items that replace what is worn out or broken. Give the money you save to charity.

Quiet down.

Jesus frequently went off to be alone with

God. Take some quiet time each day just to keep company with God. Even spending as few as 15 minutes a day with God in silence will bring you peace.



Why Do Catholics Do That?

Why do Catholics give new names at Baptism?

Catholics often give their children new names at Baptism to celebrate the new spiritual life of the one being baptized. In the Bible, name changes were often associated with significant life-changes. For example, Simon's name was changed



to "Peter" when Jesus singled him out to be the first pope (Matthew 16:18). Often a saint's name will be chosen at Baptism, as a way of placing the baptized person under the patronage of the saint as their intercessor and model in holiness.

Who is the real Catholic Church?

The Catholic Church is not just a building or a group of people. Rather, the real Church is a family begun by Jesus, extending all over the world, stretching through time and space.

In **Heaven** live those members who completed their earthly lives as God intended.

Members in **Purgatory** did their best to follow Jesus but died without having made adequate penance for their venial sins. Our prayers will help them get to Heaven.

And those of us who are members on Earth are



still living within the family, trying to make the journey to Heaven.

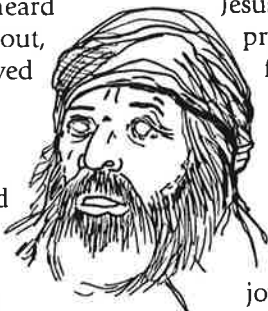
All three groups make up the Church and we are all connected forever. So not only can we ask our friends on Earth to pray for us, we can appeal for prayers to those who are face-to-face with God.

The Church began with Christ but is populated by humans who don't always choose well. Still, we are all called to live fully in Christ's image. Those of us on Earth just have to keep trying.

from Scripture

Mark 10:46-52, a blind man leads

Bartimaeus was a blind beggar who saw Jesus clearly. When he heard that Jesus was near he cried out, "Son of David," a title reserved for the Messiah. Although people tried to shush him, Bartimaeus persisted until Jesus noticed him and called him over. Immediately, Bartimaeus threw off his cloak and ran to Jesus' side. Even the little he had was discarded to get to Jesus.



Bartimaeus stood before Jesus humbly, but he was confident that Jesus had the power to do whatever he asked. The only person in Mark's Gospel to call

Jesus, "Master," Bartimaeus asked Jesus for his sight. When his prayer was answered, Bartimaeus followed Jesus as his disciple.

It is this profound trust that Jesus wants to elicit from the crowd – and from us. The difficulties of being Christian in a secular world can blind us to the joys of following Jesus. Try to approach Jesus with excitement and humble confidence. When we trust him as Bartimaeus did, we become true disciples who can tackle the difficult task of leading others down the road to God.

Q & A How can I get more out of Scripture?

In the crush of daily life, Scripture reading may get overlooked. Yet, spending daily time with God's Word is the surest way to hear his voice. Try these tips:



Get a Catholic Bible. There are more books in Catholic versions. You don't want to miss important doctrine they contain. Catholic Bibles will have the words "Imprimatur" and/or "Nihil obstat," meaning that the margin notes are in keeping with Church teaching.

Start deliberately. Pick a book, one of the Gospels, perhaps, and read it each day section by section or chapter by chapter. Give it your full attention while reading. Read the footnotes, and write down any connections it inspires to your life.

Memorize a verse. Did a line or verse strike you? Write it down and learn it by heart. The more you know of God's Word, the more you know of God.

Look for a take-away: Ask God what he wants you to know from your time with his Word. Then be sure to listen with an open heart.

Feasts & Celebrations

Oct. 2 – Feast of the Guardian Angels. All of us have a guardian angel, in charge of protecting us and watching over us day and night. Each angel is unique, and no two are alike. On this feast day, remember to thank the Guardian Angels for the work they do to bring us to Heaven.

Oct. 7 – Our Lady of the Rosary (1571). Pope Pius V created this feast in thanksgiving to Our Lady of Victory who helped the Christians defeat the Ottoman Turks. Since it was believed that they won after praying the Rosary,

the feast was renamed Our Lady of the Rosary by Pope Gregory XIII.

Oct. 9 – St. Denis (250). Originally born in third-century Italy, St. Denis was sent with two companions, Rusticus and Eleutherius, to Christianize Gaul (modern day France). St. Denis became the first bishop of Paris. The three men were martyred by the pagan authorities for their success in converting souls to Christ. He is a patron saint of France.
