40th Anniversary  
Of St. John Paul II  
being elevated to Pope

Pope John Paul II was born Karol Józef Wojtyła on May 18, 1920, in Wadowice, Poland. He was ordained in 1946, became the bishop of Ombi in 1958, and became the archbishop of Krakow in 1964. He was made a cardinal by Pope Paul VI in 1967, and in 1978 became the first non-Italian pope in more than 400 years. He was a vocal advocate for human rights and used his influence to effect political change. He died in Italy in 2005. It

was announced in July of 2013 that he would be declared a saint in April of the following year.

As many of you know, our pastor, Father Ted had the privilege to study as a student from St. John Paul II. As a tribute to our pastor and St. John Paul II, Mr. Carl Pillo has developed a display of the connection from Pope to Pastor to Parishioners of St. Padre Pio Parish. Please take a few minutes after mass to enjoy the display boards he has donated to our parish.

**October 2, 2018, Elba Site**

*We are a family answering the call of Jesus to be shepherds to his flock and to respond to his command: "Feed my Sheep."*

**Members in Attendance:** Father Thaddeus Bocianowski, Barb Hendershott, Reg Barcomb, Linda DeVito, Debbie Greene, Diane Fiorentino, Mary Ann Dorman, Kevin Hendershott, Mindy Stempin, Charles Zambito, Debbie Ambrewster, Pauli Miano.

**Members absent:** Deacon Paul Kulczyk, Sue Zambito, Justin Calarco-Smith,

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm by Barb Hendershott. The opening prayer was offered by Father Ted. Diane volunteered to offer the prayers at the next meeting.

**Minutes from the previous meeting:** Motion to approve the minutes as written made by Diane, seconded by Mary Ann. Motion carried.

### **Open Forum:**

#### **Organization and Committee Reports:**

*Altar and Rosary* – Diane – Donations were made to St. Luke's Mission of Mercy and Oktoberfest. Penny Social is November 18<sup>th</sup> at the Elba Fire Hall. Donations of items and money are welcome.

*Men's Group* – Kevin – We will be helping with set up for the Penny Social. It was decided to cancel our Wine Tasting event scheduled for this month and revisit the idea after the first of the year. Pancake Breakfast is November 11<sup>th</sup>, and donations will be sent to a veterans' group.

*Liturgy* – Barb asked if there were any questions or concerns about the new ministry guidelines. Pauli stated that there was a question in Elba about people selected to bring the gifts forward at weekend Masses. Discussion about greeters not knowing everyone involved in requests, and that family members of the deceased should notify the greeters that they wish to bring forward the gifts. Item will be in the bulletin.

#### **Areas of Attention:**

##### **Community Building:**

**Faith Formation:** Mary Ann – Protecting God's Children session on Sept. 8<sup>th</sup> was attended by 21 people. We are in compliance with that requirement. The parent meeting on the 9<sup>th</sup> was attended by about 20 parents. We have changed the Confirmation class time to Wednesday evenings, 6 to 7 pm, with Mass to follow. Father will be having a teaching Mass once a month, especially directed to the students. We are working to establish a youth group. Amanda Bergman was trained in CLI at Christ the King.

##### **Stewardship:**

*Building and Grounds* – Reg – Elba – The storage shed restoration is finished and the new roof has been completed by R.A. Hartz as a donation. The three altar halogen spot lamps were updated with LED spot lamps which provide less glare and lower heat intensity. The electric cord to the sanctuary light has been re-routed through the wall to the sacristy providing a neater appearance.

*Oakfield* – The Finance Council approved the repair and update of the two large windows facing Maple St. as well as the window in the "crying room" that replaced the former entrance. Work will be scheduled for 2019, pending approval from the Diocese.

*Oktoberfest* – Deb reported that about \$12,000 was raised, similar to last year. Basket raffle did a little better, meals and cash raffle about the same. Final numbers are not yet available. Having runners take baskets to winners was popular.

## Old Business:

*Parish Councils' Need for Review and planning* – The Administration section is completed. Copies were distributed at last meeting. Motion to accept pending minor technical changes, ie. punctuation, capitalization, etc. made by Linda, seconded by Kevin. Motion passed.

## New Business:

*Changes to Parish Council dates for next two meetings* – Barb – Because we moved the date of this meeting, we suggest that the next two meetings be moved out by a week. That schedules the next meeting for November 5<sup>th</sup>, a Monday because the Tuesday is Election Day. The December meeting will be on the 18<sup>th</sup>. No objections to the changes.

*Paper Recycling* – Deb – The bins at Oakfield are always full and the company has been lax in picking them up. Other non-for-profits in the area are having the same problem. The company reports that the business is no longer profitable and are reluctant to spend resources to service the bins. The church receives no money for the service provided. Paper recycling, along with plastics, glass, and metal is available free of charge at the ARC transfer station on West Main St. Rd. in Batavia. Motion by Kevin, seconded by Pauli, to have the bins removed. Motion carried.

## Pastor's Comments:

The St. Padre Pio Celebration went well, the church was full and the luncheon was well attended. Linda reported that Alice Fagnan, Pauli Miano, and she organized and purchased the food. A & R members baked desserts. Reg took care of set up and beverages. Many people came to help. Father said that benches and engraved bricks will be added to the Holy Family area in front of the church at a later date. Father would like to have a special flag raising at Elba after the 8 am Mass on Veterans' Day. He will be contacting veterans and scouts to participate. He reported that Laurie Laycock has been appointed to the Diocesan Pastoral Council. They meet four times a year.

## Adjournment and Closing Prayer:

The meeting adjourned at 8:02 pm. Father offered the closing prayer.

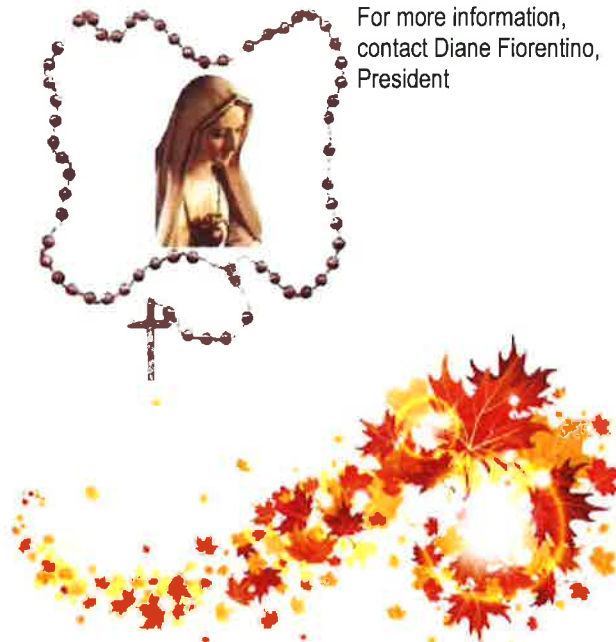
